

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.


CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, and Arrest Demographics.


TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of February, 2011, is at a total of 1,496 offenses, up from 1,377 offenses last February, a 9% increase. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,263, the crime rate is 22.24 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of February of this year, compared to the 21.39 crimes per 1,000 population last year, a 4% increase*. Other Crimes absorb the majority, 67%, of this month's crime activity (n = 999). Property crimes fall in second place with 21% (n = 313). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 11% (n = 171) and crimes against persons at 1% (n = 13).




Year to date data includes January through November, of which there is a total of 17,567 offenses, up from 14,652 last November, a 9% increase. Again, other crimes has the highest percentage to total crimes at 56% (n = 9,908). Similar to this month's data, property crimes take second place at 32% (n = 5,552). Following are the crimes of proactive policing at 10% (n = 1,817) and crimes against persons at 2% (n = 290).




CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 8 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 13 offenses in this area this month, down from 27 last February, a 52% decrease. The following chart demonstrates this month's activity compared to February of last year's activity. Aggravated Assaults are significantly lower, down to 8 from 19, a 58% decrease.




Bellows bar graph indicates the year to date data for crimes against persons. Total number of year to date crimes against persons this year is 40, down from 52 of last February, a 23% decrease. Aggravated Assaults are down by 22% and so is Forcible Rape with 63% decrease this year.




PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 319 Property Crimes, a 19% decrease from last February. While majority of the crimes in this category indicate an evident drop this month, the Motor Vehicle Theft is higher than it was in February of last year.




To date this year, 746 property offenses have occurred, down from 826 last year at this same time, a 10% decrease. All Other Larceny indicates a 15% drop from last year, Burglary/ Breaking & Entering is down by 9%, and Theft from Building is down by 8%. While the remaining majority of offenses in this category also indicate drop, the Motor Vehicle Theft shows an increase this month, up to 21 from 10 of last year.




CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart on the following page indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 171 offenses have occurred this month, a 6% increase comparing to last February (n = 161). This increase is mainly related to Drug/Narcotic Violations reported this month, which are up by 35%.




To date for the year, there have been 364 crimes of proactive policing, up 15%. Again, Drug/Narcotic Violations indicate a 44% increase in February.




OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 999 Other Crimes, up from 801 last February, a 25% increase. Intimidation is down by 20%. Simple Assault is higher, a 95% increase. All Other Offenses are higher than last February, a 26% increase.




To date this year, there have been 1967 other crimes, up from 1669 last February, an 18% increase. Runaways are down 50%. Simple assault is up by 22 % and similar to above, all other offenses are up, a 19% increase.




ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS


In February, there were a total of 936 arrests, as opposed to 813 arrests in February of last year, a 15% increase; that is 0.63 arrests per crime for February of this year, as opposed to 0.0.59 arrests per crime for February of last year, a 6% increase of arrests per crime.

This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male (n = 601), as opposed to female (n = 335) and Caucasian (n = 500) and African American (n = 393) as opposed to Hispanic (n = 35), Asian (n = 0), or other/unknown/bi-racial (n = 8).





Caucasian males make up the majority of offenders for the month of January, totaling 32% (n = 297). African American males account for 30% (n = 279) of the offenders this month. Caucasian females make up 22% (n = 203) and African American females make up 12% (n = 117). Hispanic males make up 3% (n = 25). There was a 1% of Hispanic Female arrestees (n = 10). There were 3 Other/Biracial males and 5 Other/Bi-racial female



are stees, insignificant total of 0.53% of these are stees . This distribution can be reviewed in the pie chart below.

EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.




TRAFFIC
