The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

CRIME ANALYSIS

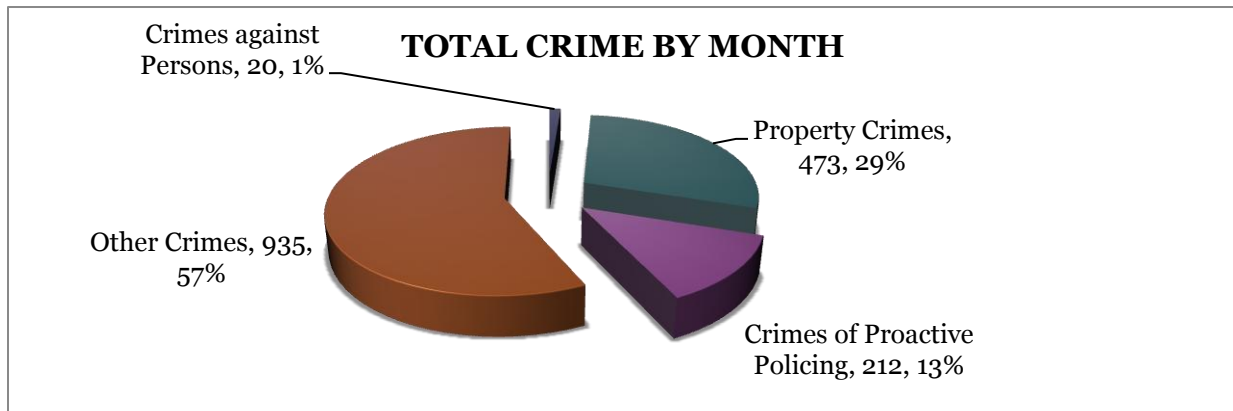
The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, Total Crime Monthly Comparison, and Next Month Predictions.

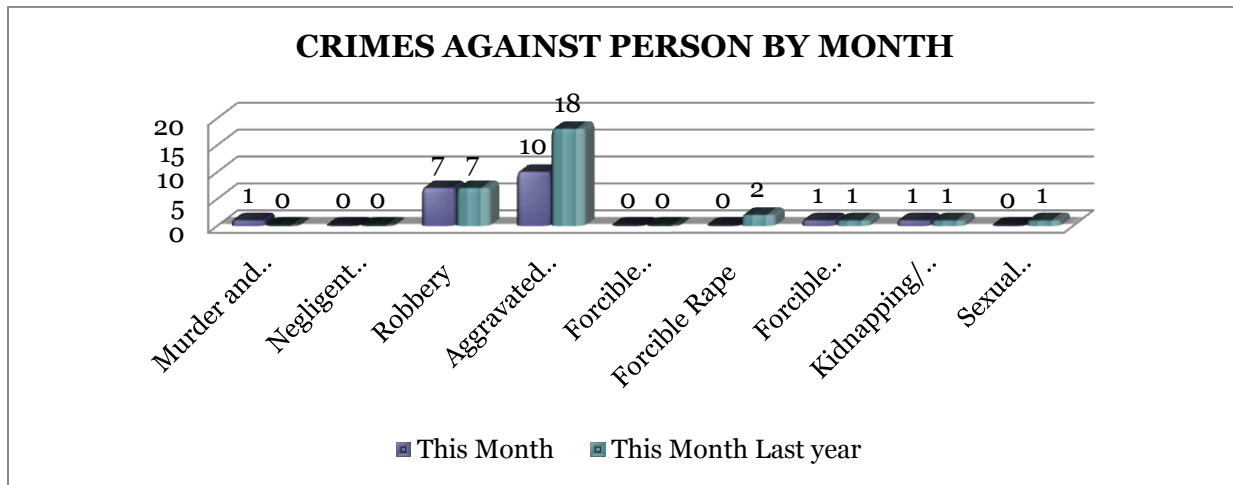
TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of January 2012 is at a total of 1,640 offenses, a 4% increase, comparing to a total of 1,570 offenses in January last year. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,351, the crime rate is at 24 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of January this year, compared to the rate of 23 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹. As indicated on a pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 57%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 935$). Property crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 29% of all the crimes ($n = 473$). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 13% ($n = 212$) and crimes against persons at 1% ($n = 20$), respectively.



CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 20 offenses in this area this month, statistically there was a 33% decrease, comparing to the last year's total in January. Aggravated Assaults have decreased significantly, comparing to the last year's data for the month of January (-44%). As demonstrated on the following chart, there are no significant changes in other crimes for this category.



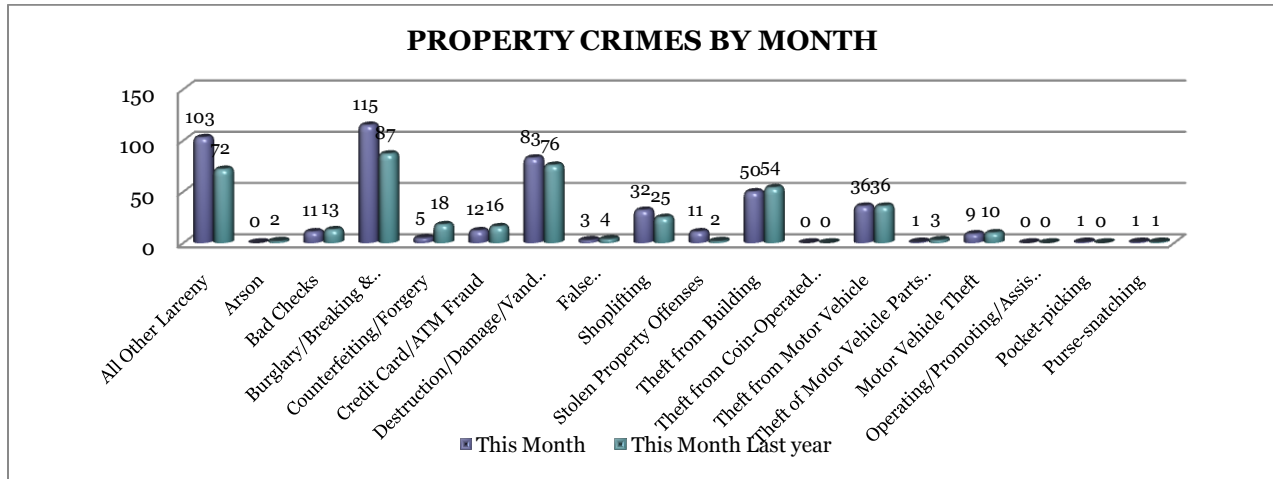

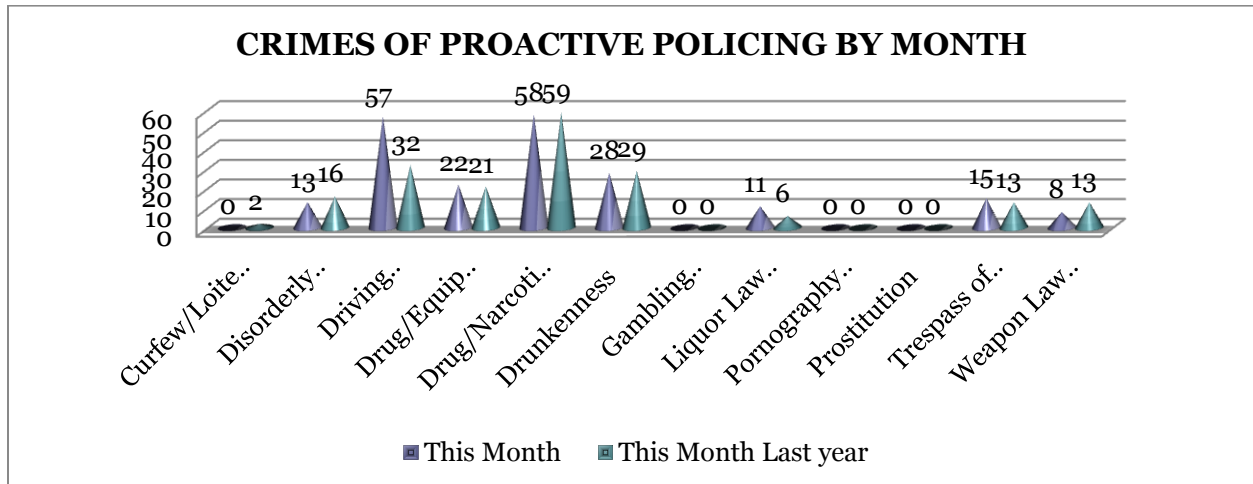
PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 473 Property Crimes, a 13% increase comparing to January of the last year. The data indicates a significant change in All Other Larceny (up 43%), Burglary/Breaking and Entering (up 32%), Shoplifting (up 28%), Stolen Property Offenses increased from 2 to 11 offenses. Another significant change can be noted in a decrease of Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories (down 67%) and Counterfeiting/Forgery (down 72%). Credit Card /ATM Fraud are down 25%, Bad Checks are down 15%, and Motor Vehicle Theft is down 10%.



CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 212 offenses have occurred this month, an 11% increase, comparing to January last year. There is an evident increase in Driving Under the Influence (up 78%), Liquor Law Violations (up 83%). Weapon Law Violations are down 38% and Disorderly Conduct is down 19%.

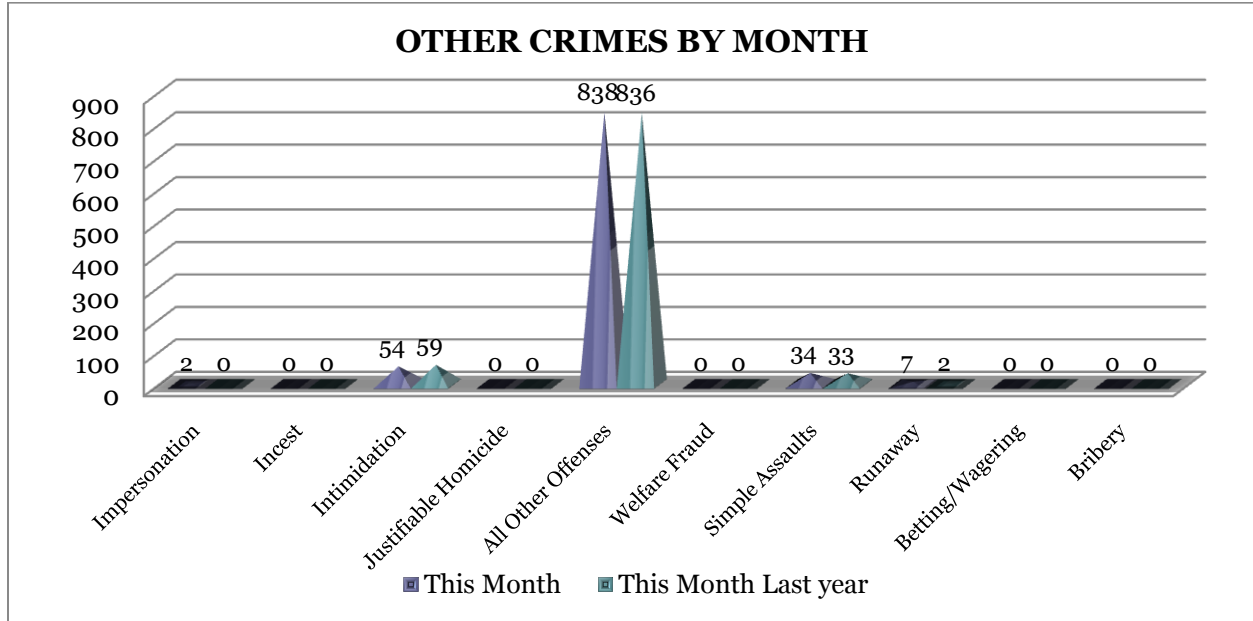

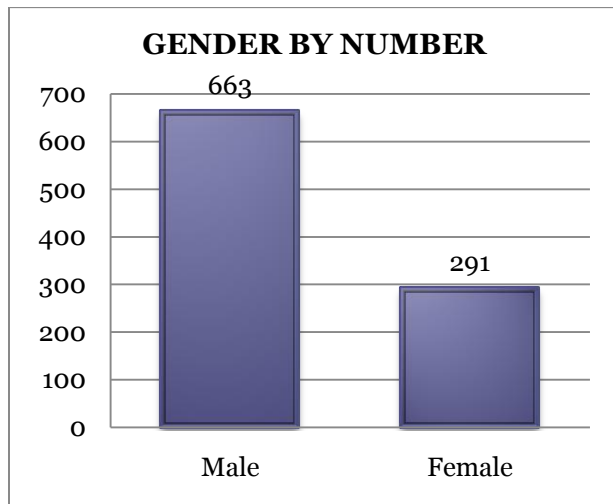
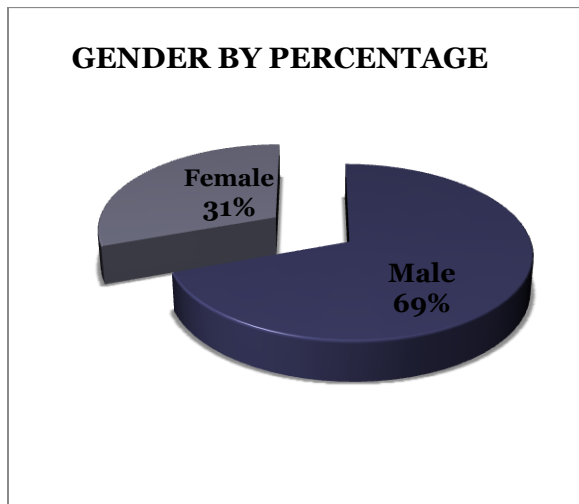
OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 935 Other Crimes, a 1% increase, comparing to last January (n = 930). The Runaway category increased from 2 to 7 incidents, while Intimidation decreased by 8%.



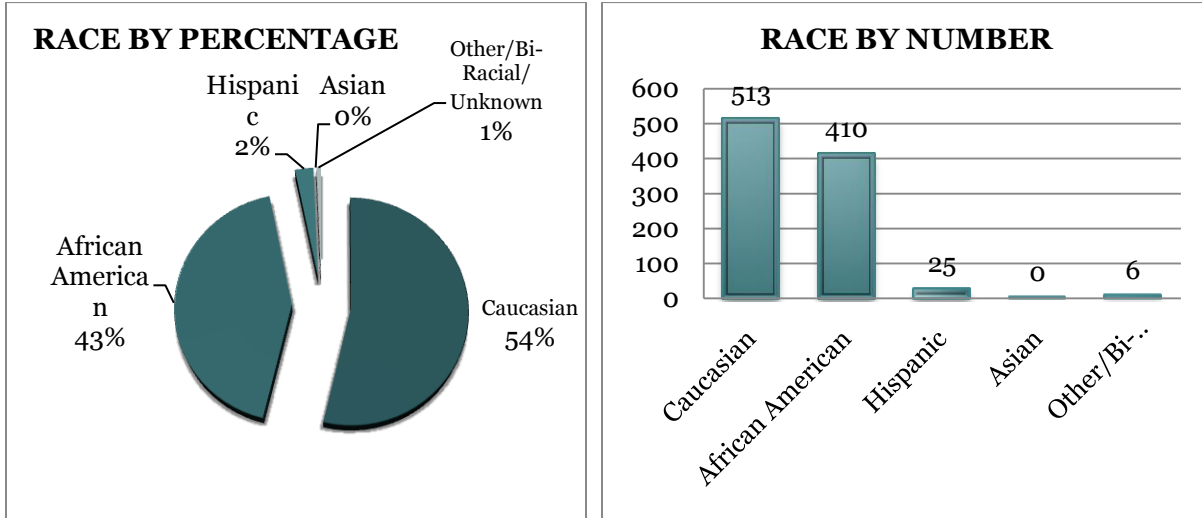
ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In January, there were a total of 954 arrests. Comparing with the last year's data for the month of January, there was a 10% increase in arrests; that is 58 arrests per 100 crimes in January of this year, comparing to 55 arrests per 100 crimes last year, a 5.7% increase. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male (n = 663), as opposed to female (n = 291) and Caucasian (n = 513) and African American (n = 410) as opposed to Hispanic (n = 25), Asian (n = 0), or other/unknown/bi-racial (n = 6).

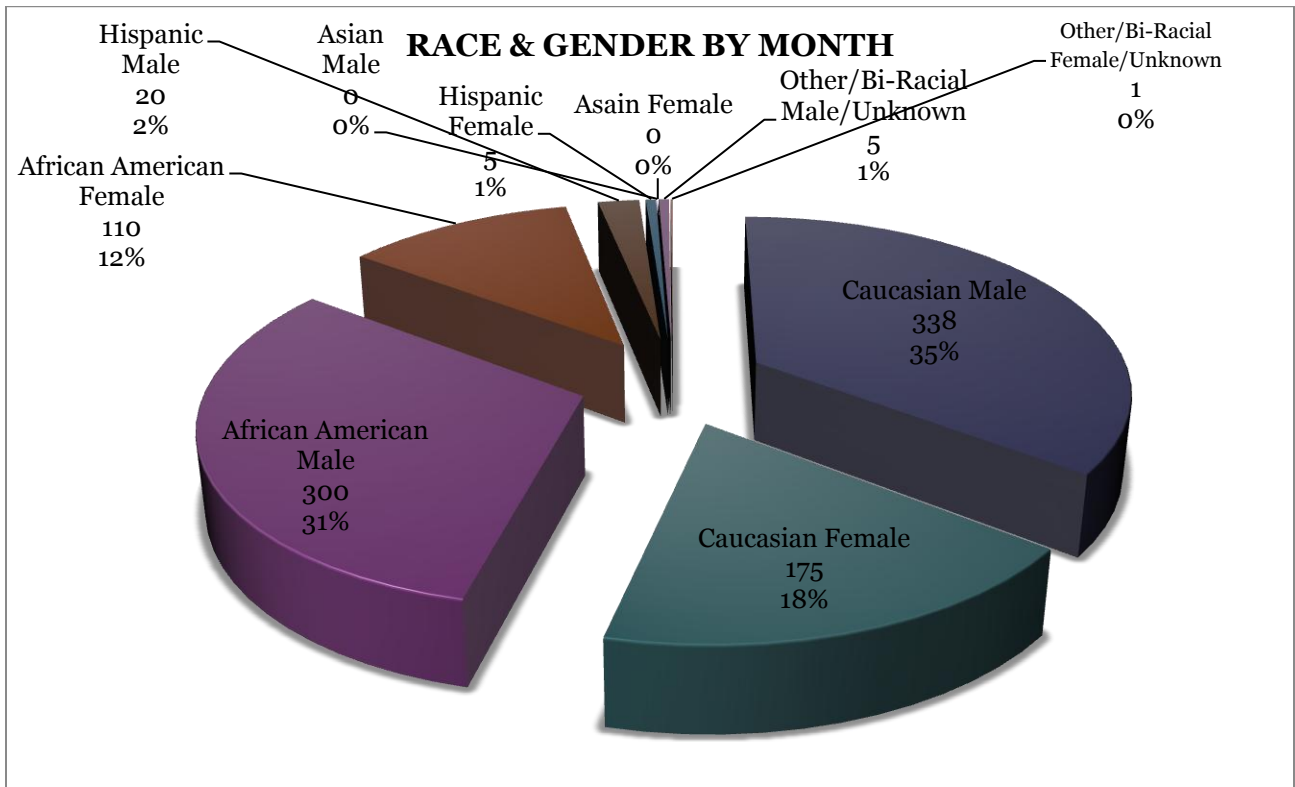

Caucasian males make up the majority, 35%, of arrestees this month ($n = 338$). African American males make up 31% of arrestees for the month of January ($n = 300$). Caucasian females make up 18% ($n = 175$) and African American females make up 12% ($n = 110$). Hispanic males make up 2% ($n = 20$) and Other/Biracial Male/Unknown make up 1% ($n = 5$). Hispanic Female and Other/Biracial Male/Unknown make up an insignificant 1% of arrestees this month each. This distribution can be reviewed in the pie chart below.

EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

WARRANTS

The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

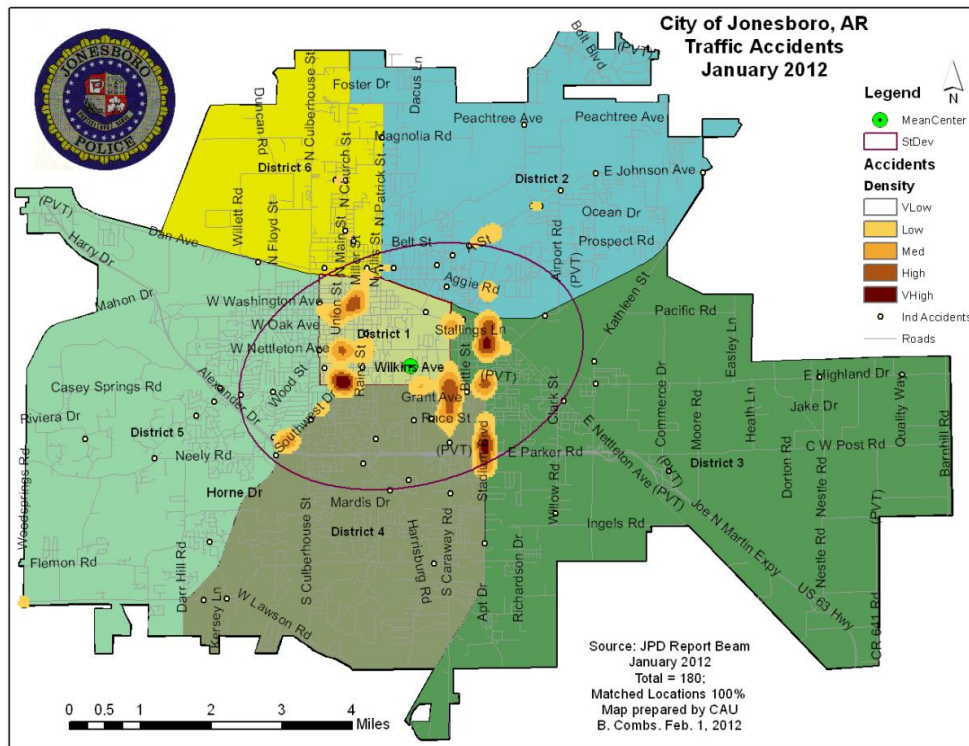

TRAFFIC

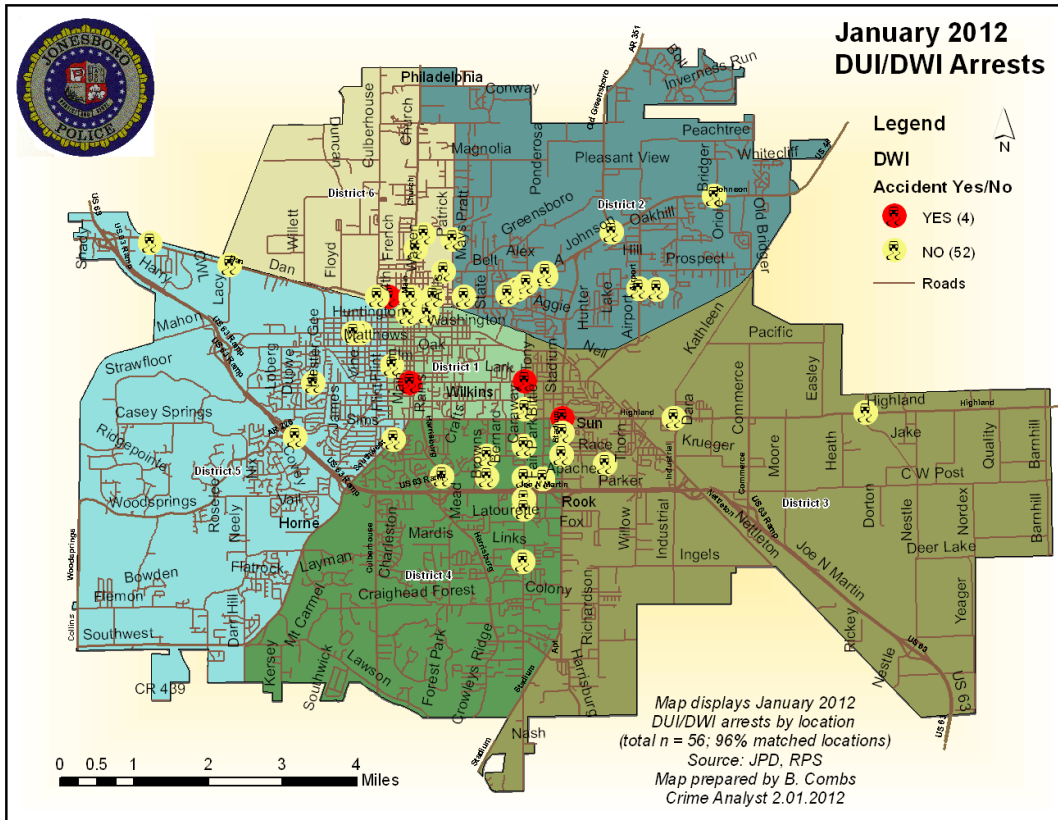
