Monthly Report

January 2013

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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, Total Crime Monthly Comparison, and Next Month Predictions.

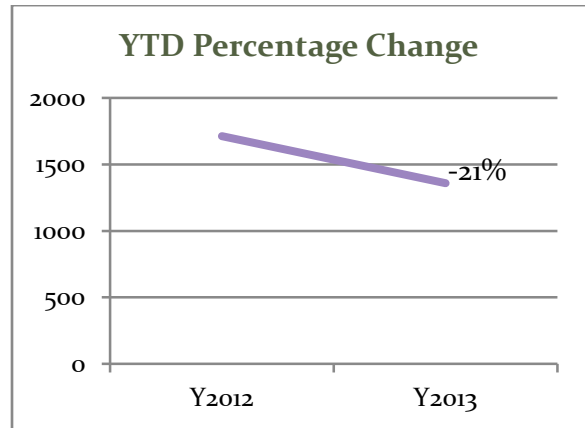
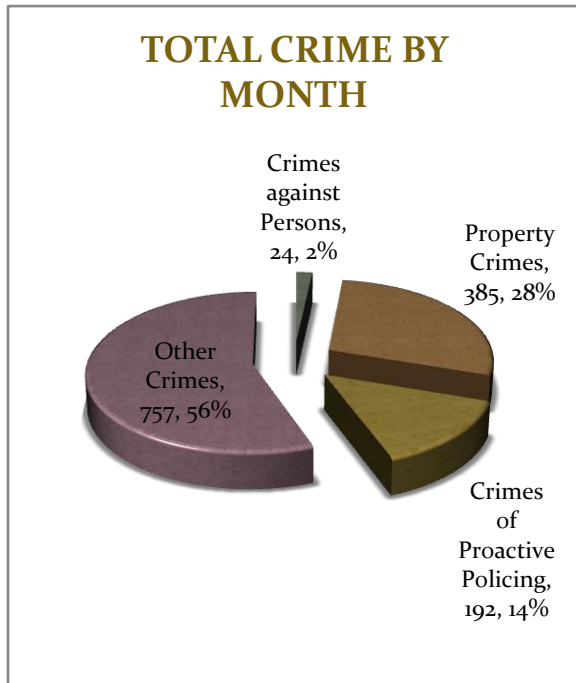
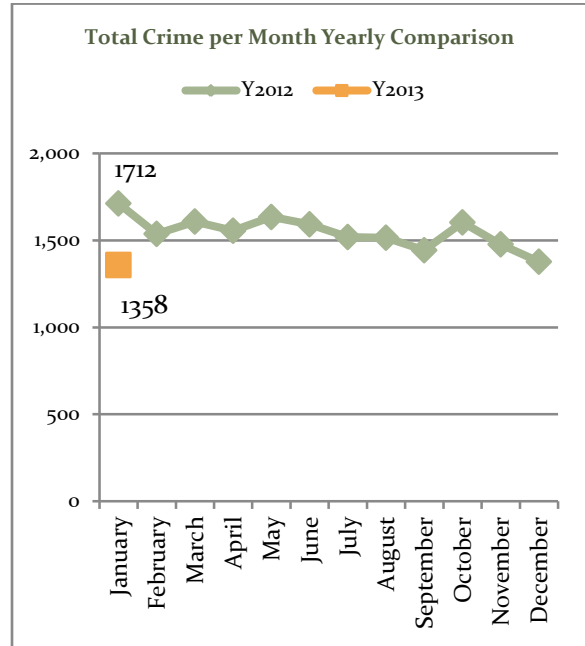
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TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of February 13 was at a total of 1,358 NIBRIS reportable offenses, a 21% decrease, comparing to the total of offenses reported in January of the last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 69,856, the crime rate January of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, comparing to 25 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, a 22% decrease. As indicated on a pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 56%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 757$). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 28% of all the crimes ($n = 385$). Following in third and fourth places are Crime of Proactive Policing, comprising of 14% ($n = 192$) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 2% ($n = 24$) of all the crimes this month.

The line charts below depict frequencies of crime and yearly percentage change for the month of January of this and the previous year.



¹ Note: Population numbers are based on 2011 & 2012 population estimate, where 2011 population estimate is 68,547.

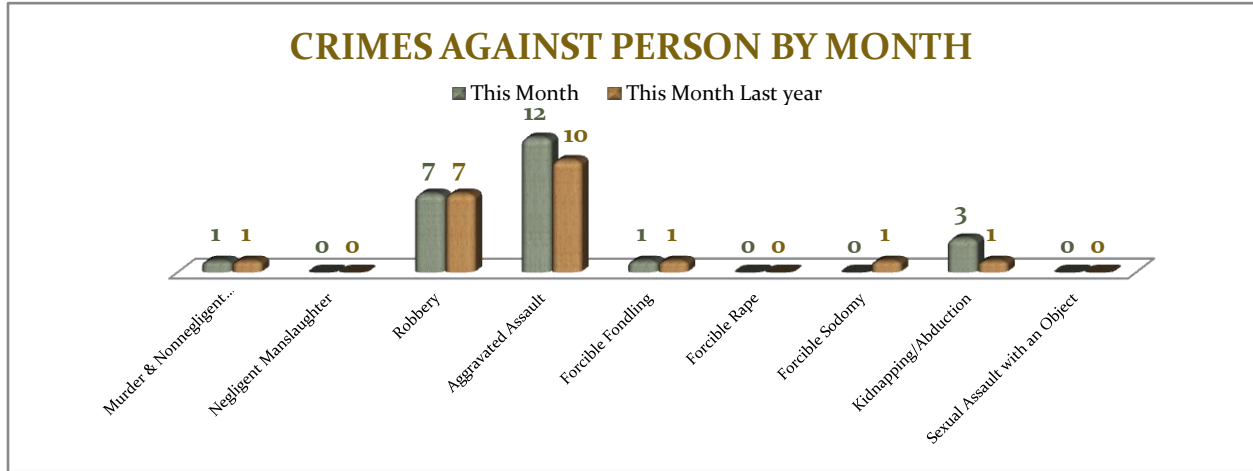
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CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 24 offenses in this area in January this year, a 14% increase, comparing to the last year's total in January. This increase, however, is largely due to the 2 more incidents of Kidnapping/Abduction

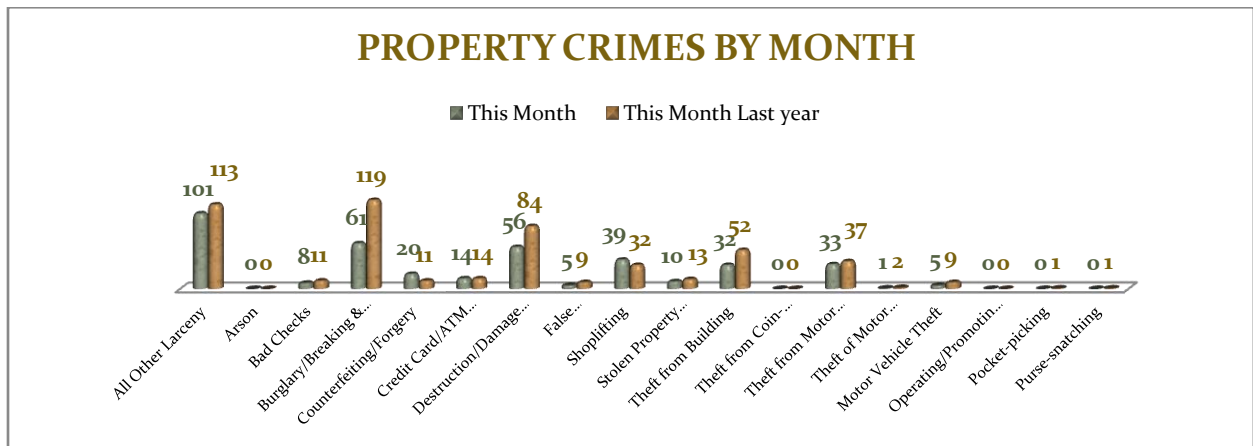
reported in January, resulting in a 200% increase and affecting the overall percentage change for the Major Persons Crimes. As demonstrated on the bar chart below, there are no significant changes in frequencies for the crimes in this category.



PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 385 Property Crimes, a 24% decrease comparing to January of the last year. The data indicates a significant

change in Theft from Building (down 38%), and Burglary/Breaking & Entering (down 33%). Also All Other Larceny decreased by 11%. No other significant changes are noted this month for this crime category.



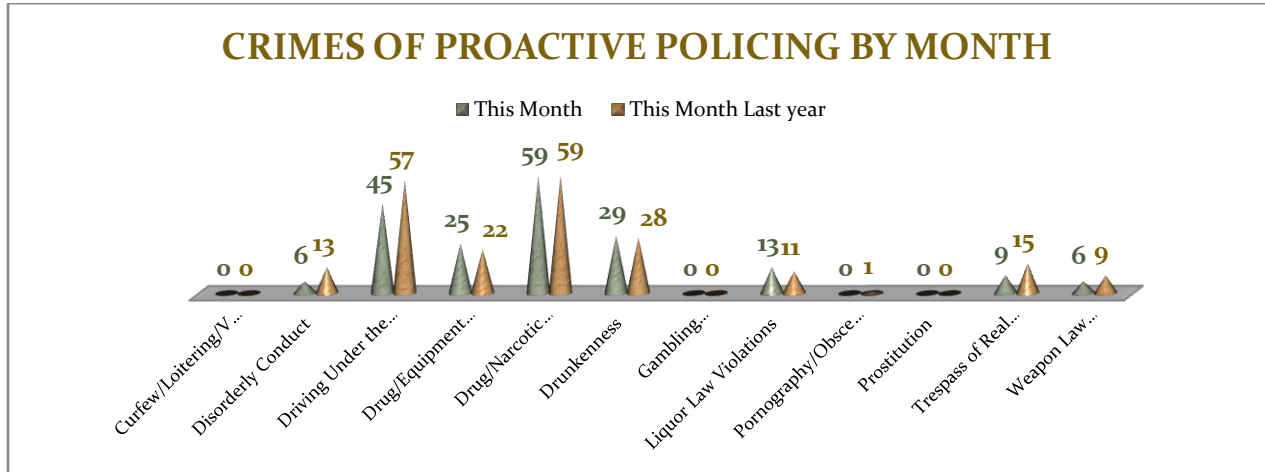
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CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A

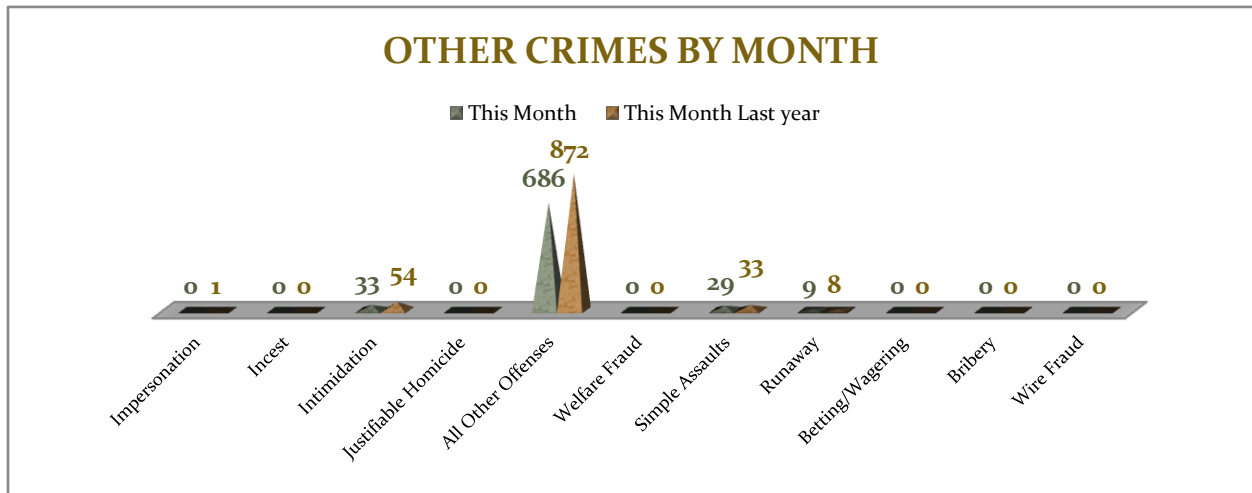
total of 192 offenses have been reported this month, an 11% decrease, comparing to January of the last year. No significant changes, however, have been noticed for the individual offenses in this crime category this month.



OTHER CRIMES

There are 11 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 757 Other Crimes reported, a 22% decrease, comparing to January of the last year (n = 968). Intimidation decreased

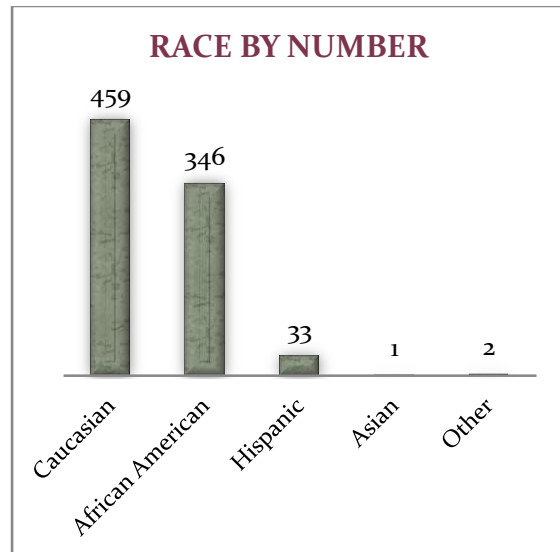
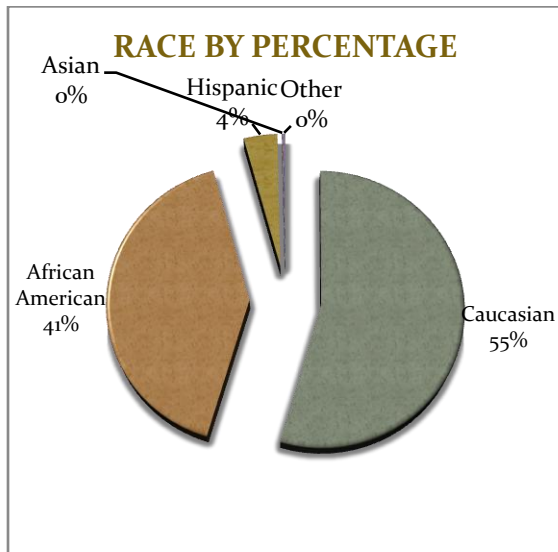
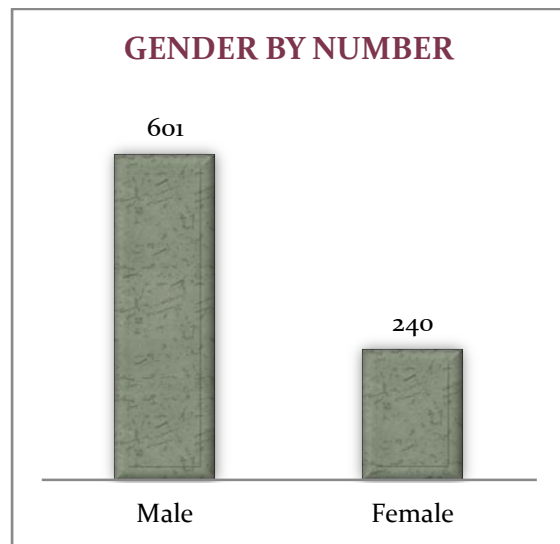
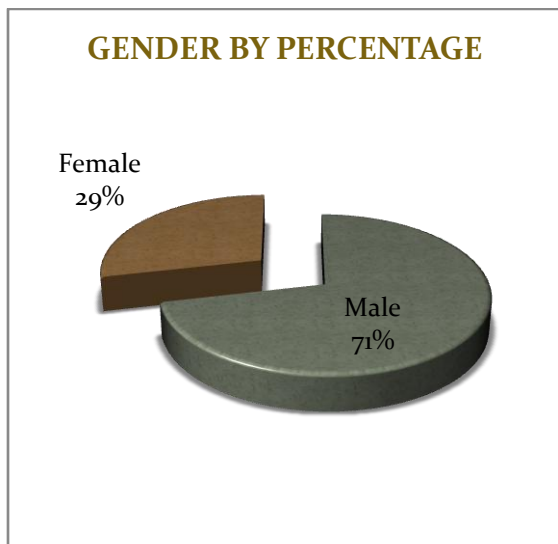
by 39% and All other Offences decreased by 21%. No other significant changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.



ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In January 2013, there were a total of 841 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. Comparing with the last year's data for the month of January, there was a 14% decrease in arrests this month. Yet, that is 62 arrests per 100 crimes in January of this year, comparing to 57 arrests per 100 crimes last year, an 8.5% increase for arrests per 100

crimes. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male ($n = 601$), as opposed to female ($n = 240$) and Caucasian ($n = 459$) and African American ($n = 346$) as opposed to Hispanic ($n = 33$), Asian ($n = 1$), or other/unknown/bi-racial ($n = 2$).

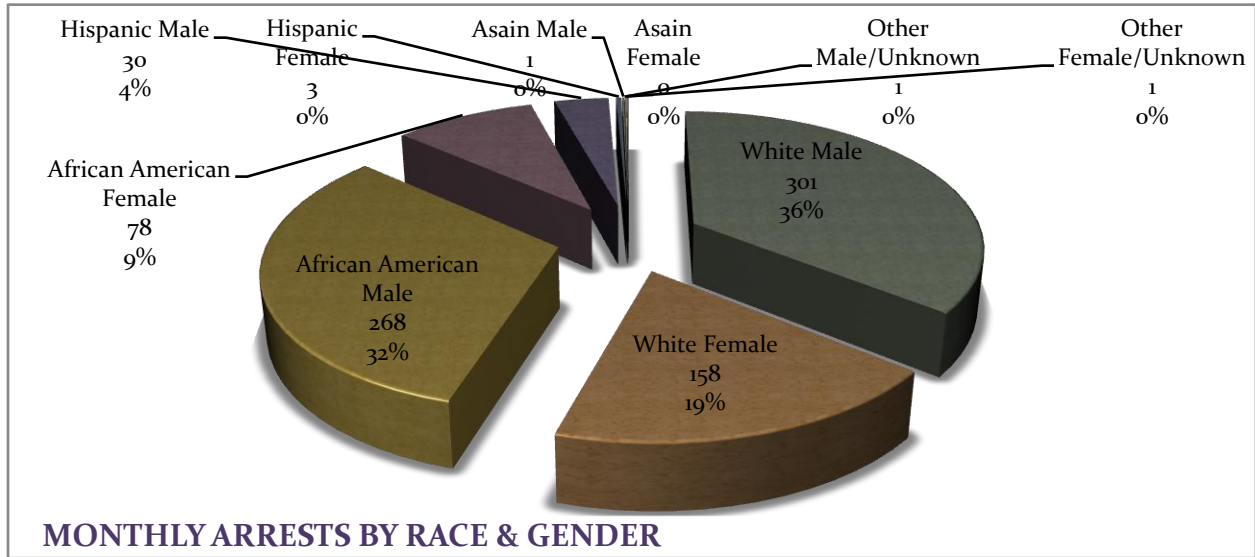


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Caucasian males make up the majority, 36%, of arrestees this month ($n = 301$). African American males make up 32% of arrestees for the month of January ($n = 268$). Caucasian females make up 19% ($n = 158$) and African American females make up 9% ($n = 78$) of arrestees this month. Hispanic

males make up 4% ($n = 30$), and Hispanic Females make up less than 1% ($n = 3$) of arrestees this month. There was 1 Asian male and 1 of each Male and Female of the unknown race or ethnicity arrested in January.



EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition,

this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are

assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is

responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

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TRAFFIC

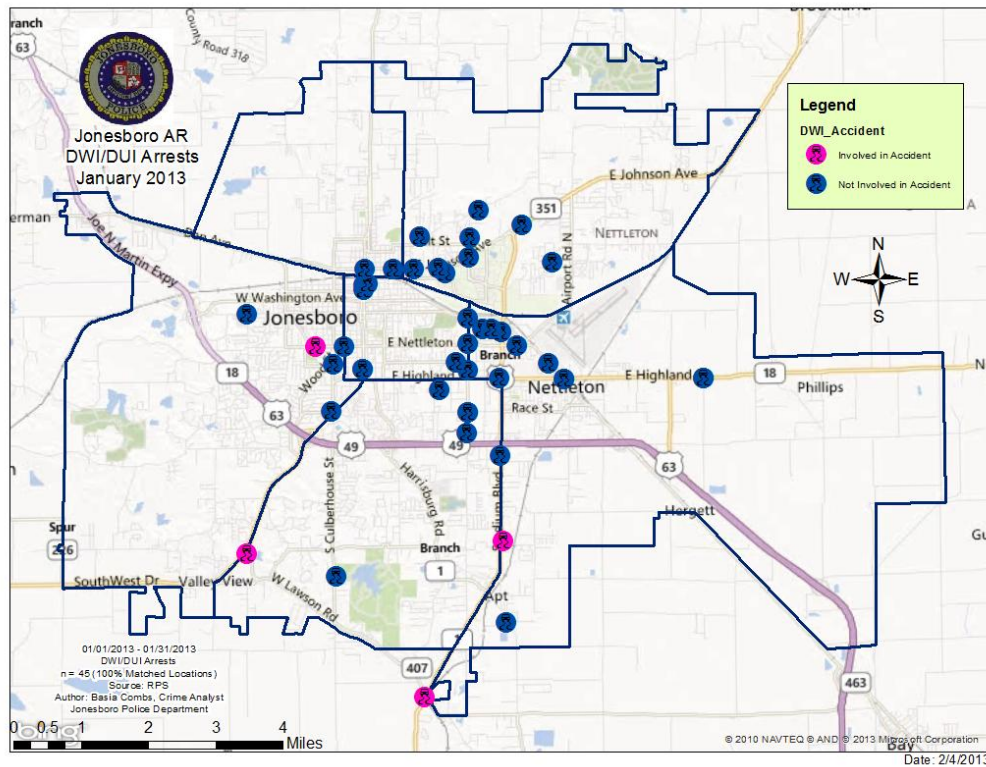
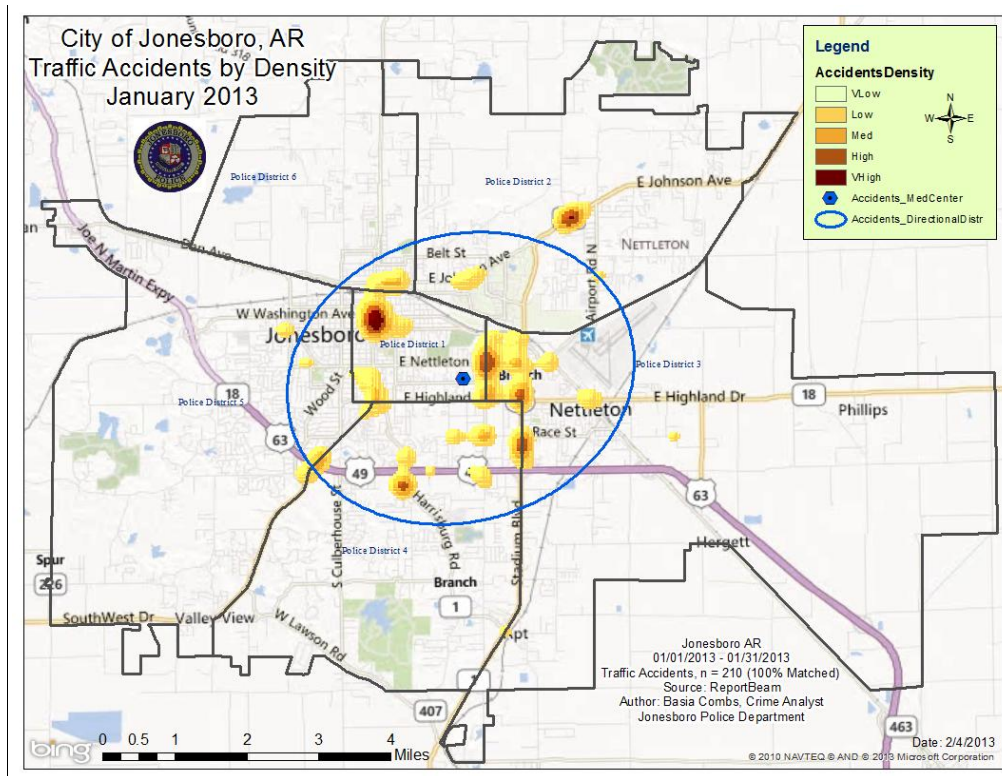
