

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.


CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, and Arrest Demographics.


TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of July 2011 is at a total of 1,605 offenses, down from 1,641 offenses July 2010, a 2% decrease. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,263, the crime rate is 23.86 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of July this year, compared to the 25.49 crimes per 1,000 population last year, a 6% drop*. As indicated on a pie chart on the following page, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 52%, of this month's crime activity (n = 830). Property crimes fall in second place and are at 35% (n = 563). Following in third and fourth places are crimes of proactive policing at 11% (n = 175) and crimes against persons at 2% (n = 37).




Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through July, of which there is a total of 11,734 offenses, up from 10,991 offenses that occurred through July last year, a 7% increase or 2% increase in crime rate per 1,000 population. Again, Other Crimes have the highest percentage of total crimes and are at 57% (n = 6,712). Property Crimes comprise 30% of total crimes to date where, n = 3,571. Crimes of Proactive Policing amount to 11% (n = 1,247) and crimes against persons comprise 2% (n = 204) of total year to date number of crimes.




CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 37 offenses in this area this month, a 37% increase, compared the last year's total in July. As demonstrated on the following chart, Aggravated Assault is higher by 64% this month and Forcible Rape increased by a total of 4 incidents. There are no significant changes in other crimes for this category.




Bellows bar graph shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons. Total number of year to date Crimes against Persons this year is 204, up 13% from July last year. This is due to the increase in a total number of Robberies, 29% up, and Forcible Rape, 45% up to date this year.




PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 563 Property Crimes, a 1% decrease comparing to July of last year. The data indicates a significant change in Theft from Building, 33% down a Burglary/Breaking and Entering, 9% down, compared to July of last year.




To date this year, 3,571 property offenses have occurred; the data indicates a 4% increase in change when compared to last year's data at this same time. Comparing to the numbers of last year, there is a 7% drop in Theft from Building and 3% drop in Burglary/Breaking & Entering. The category of Shoplifting has increased by 34%.




CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 175 offenses have occurred this month, a 1% increase, comparing to July last year. There is a noticeable increase in Disorderly Conduct offenses, 38% up, Driving Under Influence, 18% up, and Drug/Narcotic Violations, 22% up.




To date for the year 2011, there have been 1,247 crimes of proactive policing, up 6% from last year's to date offenses. Disorderly Conduct Offenses are 15% up, Drug/Equipment Violations and Drug/Narcotic violations are both up, 26% and 37%, consecutively. Weapon Law Violations are up 23%. We are seeing a drop in Driving Under Influence and in Drunkenness, 11% and 16% down, respectively, and in Trespass of Real Property, 21% down.




OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 830 Other Crimes, down from 871 in last July, a 5% decrease. Simple Assaults are up, a 34% increase and All Other Offenses within Other Crimes categories are down 7%.




To date this year, there have been 6,712 Other Crimes offenses up from 6,184 from last year's to date offenses, a 7% increase. Simple Assaults are up 19% and All Other Offenses within the Other Crimes category are up 9%. Intimidation offenses are down by 3% to date this year, compared to last year's data.





ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS


In July, there were a total of 881 arrests, as opposed to 865 arrests in July last year, a 2% increase; that is .55 arrests per crime in July of this year, comparing to .53 arrests per crime last year, a 4% increase in arrests per crime.

This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male (n = 624), as opposed to female (n = 257) and Caucasian (n = 416) and African American (n = 414) as opposed to Hispanic (n = 35), Asian (n = 0), or other/unknown/bi-racial (n = 16).










African American males make up the majority, 35%, of arrestees this month (n=304). Caucasian males make up 31% of arrestees for the month of July (n=276). Caucasian females make up 16% (n=140) and African American females make up 12% (n=110). Hispanic males make up 3% (n=30). There were also 14 Other/Biracial Males, 5 Hispanic Females, and 2 Other/Biracial Females arrested in the month of July. This distribution can be reviewed in the pie chart on the following page.

EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

PROWL

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.




TRAFFIC
