

JONESBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT Monthly Report November 2012

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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.


CRIME ANALYSIS


The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one parttime Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, administration for improved staffing decisions, and the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, Total Crime Monthly Comparison, and Next Month Predictions.

TOTAL CRIME


The crime activity for the month of November 2012 was at a total of 1,115 reportable offenses. NIBRIS an 11% decrease, comparing to the total of offenses in November of last year. With Jonesboro population equal to 67,351, the crime rate was at 17 crimes per 1,000 population for the month of November this year, comparing to 19 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, an 11% decrease. As indicated on a pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 63%, of this month's crime activity (n = 708). Crimes of Proactive Policing fall into a second place and comprise of 22% of all the crimes (n = 242). Following in third and fourth places are Property Crimes, comprising of 14% (n = 152) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 13% (n = 13) of all the crimes this month.


Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through November 2012. A total of 13,640 NIBRIS reportable offenses were reported in 2012, an 11% decrease, comparing to the same period last vear. The year to date crime rate amounts to 203 offenses per 1,000 population, compared to 218 offenses per 1,000 population last year (down 7%). A 68% of all the crimes is attributed to Other Crimes category (n = 9,280). Crimes of Proactive Policing amount to 20% (n =2,715) of all the crimes. Property Crimes comprise of 11% of all the crimes to date, where n = 1,447; Crimes against Persons comprise of 1% of a total year to date number of crimes (n = 198).










CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 13 offenses in this area this month, a 57% decrease, comparing to the last year's total in November. Aggravated Assaults are down 40% this month. Robberies have also decreased by 77%. As demonstrated on the bar chart below, there are no significant changes in other crimes for this category.




A bar graph on the following page shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons, which amounts to a total of 198 incidents for this category of crimes, a 12% decrease, comparing to the year to date data of last year. Robberies are down 32%, and forcible rapes are down 73%. Aggravated Assaults are up 13%. To date we have 2 more murders than last year to date.




PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 152 Property Crimes, a 14% increase comparing to November of last year. The data indicates a significant change in Theft from Building (down 43%), and Destruction / Damage / Vandalism (down 44%). The All Other Larceny is up 67%, Burglary/ Breaking & Entering is up 75%, and Shoplifting is up 20%. No other significant changes are noted this month for this crime category.




To date this year, 1,447 property offenses have occurred, an 8% decrease, comparing to the last year's data at this same time. The following significant changes are noted this year: All Other Larceny (down 20%), Bad Checks (down 40%), Counterfeiting/ Forgery (down 22%), Credit Card / ATM Fraud (down 28%), and Theft from Building (down 32%), while Shoplifting is up 11%.



CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING


Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As a chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 242 offenses have been reported this month, a 21% increase, comparing to November last year. There is a significant increase in Drug/Narcotic Violations (up 61%), Drunkenness offenses increased 28%, and so did Drug/ Equipment Violations (up 15%). Weapon Law Violations are down 78%.



To date for the year 2012, there have been 2,417 crimes of proactive policing reported, an overall 12% increase, comparing to the last year's to date data. Driving Under the Influence is up 49%,


Drug/ Narcotic Violations are up 7%, Drunkenness is up 8%, and Liquor Law Violations increased by 104% this year. Disorderly Conduct is down 10% and Weapon Law Violations decreased by 26%

this year. Prostitution is down 100%. There changes noted for other offenses in this are no other statistically significant category.




OTHER CRIMES

There are 11 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 708 Other Crimes, a 20% decrease, comparing to last November (n =887). Intimidation is down 25%, Simple Assaults are down 60%, and All other Offences are down 19%. No other significant changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.




To date this year, there have been 9,280 Other Crimes offenses, a 20% decrease comparing to the last year's to date data. Intimidation offenses are down 12%, Simple Assaults decreased by 26%, and All Other Offenses decreased by 11%. No other statistically significant changes have been observed for other offenses within this category, comparing to the last year's data.





ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In November, there were a total of 747 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. Comparing with the last year's data for the month of November, there was a 5% decrease in arrests this month; that is 67 arrests per 100 crimes in November of this year, comparing to 63 arrests per 100 crimes last year, a 6%




increase for arrests per 100 crimes. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of offenders have been male (n = 538), as opposed to female (n = 209) and Caucasian (n = 429) and African American (n = 281) as opposed to Hispanic (n = 32), Asian (n = 0), or other/unknown/bi-racial (n = 5).






Caucasian males make up the majority, 38%, of arrestees this month (n = 288). African American males make up 30% of arrestees for the month of November (n = 221). Caucasian females make up 19% (n = 141) and African American females make up 8% (n = 60) of arrestees this month.



Hispanic males make up 3% (n = 24), and Hispanic Females make up 1% (n = 8) of arrestees this month. Other Male / Unknown race arestees make up yet another 1% (n = 5) of all he arestees in November.



EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition,

this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency - 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same

district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division

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is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.



TRAFFIC




